

Who is St. Albert the Great, our Patron Saint?

Born in Lauingen, Swabia (now southern Germany) in his family's castle along the Danube River around the year 1200AD, St. Albert joined the newly founded Order of Preachers, aka the Dominicans, in 1223 while a student at the University of Padua. He became widely renowned for his knowledge of the natural sciences, and also as the teacher and mentor of St. Thomas Aquinas. He studied and taught

in Paris, Köln (Cologne), and Rome, and in 1260 he was named bishop of Regensburg (Ratisbon). Having resolved many administrative, financial, and pastoral problems there, in 1262 he resigned his bishopric and returned to teaching and research. Vigorous and clear in mind until late in life, he died on Nov. 15, 1280 in Cologne, where he is buried in St. Andrea's Church. He was beatified in 1622 and canonized in 1931.







+ Almost 70 Years of Catholic Campus Ministry at Michigan Technological University +

As we celebrate **our Patronal Feast this Sunday**, I wanted to run this little thumbnail sketch of our history. This coming May we will celebrate 70 years since Fr. Arnie Thompson established the first campus ministry! I remember Fr. Thompson from his last assignment as pastor of St. Mary Queen of Peace in Kingsford. He would celebrate the school Masses at the Catholic school from time to time in the late '80s and early '90s. Neither of us could have guessed that our paths would be further intertwined! **May 1946**: Fr. Arnold Thompson (†19 Dec 1992) starts the **Newman Club** while pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Franklin Mine (in the little neighborhood just west of the Quincy Mine Hoist).

May 1950: Newman House at 1301 Ruby Avenue purchased with leadership of Fr. August Franczek (†13 Nov 2014). I was blessed to meet Fr. Gus at a wedding in the summer of 2011 at his parish in Hale, MI. He served there in the Diocese of Gaylord from 1994 until his death.

18 June 1958: Fr. William McGee appointed full-time Newman Chaplain

5 May 1963: Groundbreaking for St. Albert the Great Church

6 October 1963: Cornerstone laid

6 January 1964: First Mass, celebrated by Msgr. Thomas Drengacz

3 May 1964: Dedication of the church, by Bishop Thomas Noa

2 October 1964: Establishment as St. Albert the Great University Parish

From the desk of Fr. Ben..

First of all, please keep Sr. Ellen and all those she's leading on the Wise Women's Retreat at this weekend in your prayers!

Today we celebrate our patron, St. Albert the Great, Bishop and Doctor of the Church! We are entrusted to St. Albert that he might pray for us before God's throne, and that we might learn from his example. Re-

nowned during his lifetime for his profound knowledge of the natural sciences, as well as for his keen philosophy and theology, he was a man of deep piety, and a man also of practical wisdom. The Church in his time called him to teach, to write, and to broker peace treaties between warring kingdoms. It is truly rare for one person to combine so many talents, and thus even during his lifetime he was called *Magnus*, the Great!

In particular, St. Albert modelled a deep respect for the distinction between faith and reason, theology and science, while also trusting that at the end of all things, truth is finally one. We may sometimes be unable to see in the short term how to reconcile different aspects of our knowledge, but we trust that in God's time all becomes clear, perhaps often only when we stand before Him face to Face.

It is often difficult to navigate the sciences as a person of faith, if only because other people don't expect faith and reason to be compatible. St. Albert shows us by his life and teaching that this is not only possible, but it is actually how the sciences began, in close companionship with faith, and the place where they are most fruitful! If someone is capable of building a nuclear bomb, it is best if they are also capable of prayerful discernment, seeking to live the commandment, "Thou shall not kill." If someone struggles to persevere in a difficult project, it is best if they call upon God's help and grace to carry on. If someone is deep in the Word of God and loves the Lord, it is best if they also respect the legitimate fruit of science and technology. As St. Albert's student Thomas would often say, "Grace builds upon, and presupposes, nature!"

Our readings are more than a little bit daunting... as we come to the end of the Liturgical Year, the Church places before us the End of Time—this is the liturgical theme of every November—it begins with All Saints' and All



Souls' Days, and ends with the great Solemnity of Christ the King (this year falling next Sunday, Nov. 22). In just a couple weeks, we'll be into Advent, and even there we will focus more


