Over 70 Years of Catholic Campus Ministry at Michigan Technological University

As we celebrate **our Patronal Feast next Sunday**, I wanted to run this little thumbnail sketch of our history. This coming May we will celebrate 72 years since Fr. Arnie Thompson established the first campus ministry! I remember Fr. Thompson from his last assignment as pastor of St. Mary Queen of Peace in Kingsford. He would celebrate the school Masses at the Catholic school from time to time in the late '80s and early '90s. Neither of us could have guessed that our paths would be further intertwined!

May 1946: Fr. Arnold Thompson (†19 Dec 1992) starts the **Newman Club** while pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Franklin Mine (in the little neighborhood just west of the Quincy Mine Hoist).

May 1950: **Newman House** at 1301 Ruby Avenue purchased with leadership of Fr. August Franczek (†13 Nov 2014). I was blessed to meet Fr. Gus at a wedding in the summer of 2011 at his parish in Hale, MI. He served there in the Diocese of Gaylord from 1994 until his death.

18 June 1958: Fr. William McGee appointed full-time **Newman Chaplain**

5 May 1963: **Groundbreaking for St. Albert the Great Church**

6 October 1963: Cornerstone laid

6 January 1964: **First Mass**, celebrated by Msgr. Thomas Dregacz

3 May 1964: **Dedication of the church**, by Bishop Thomas Noa (This May will be 54 year!)

2 October 1964: Establishment as **St. Albert the Great University Parish**

Religious Alliance Against Pornography Webinars: Entitled "Parents, Kids and Pornography: The Attack on a Generation," the webinar will focus on the use of pornography by youth within our faith communities, along with practical steps that parents & religious leaders can implement to protect our youth. An anonymous survey at a Catholic high school indicated that 70% of the students reported viewing pornography several times per week or more, while only 11% of the students reported that they did not view pornography. I write this column on Monday as I prepare to leave for a week of training & fundraising in Florida. I'll be spending a couple days meeting with St. Al's alumni and supporters, and the bulk of the time at St. Vincent de Paul Seminary in Boynton Beach for training by the Seminary Formation Council. The theme for this week of the 8-week, 2 year program is "Christian Psychology & Integration." **Please pray for all of that, both training and fundraising, to bear good fruit!**

The Gospel this Sunday has a classic verse that invites us to think about how we interpret the Scriptures: "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven." Very frequently this verse is thrown in the faces of Catholics as yet another example of how the Catholic faith is unbiblical. You might ask someone claiming this, "Do you call your father 'Father or Dad'?!?" If they say yes, then apparently they're ignoring Jesus, too!

Even more to the point, we see "Father" used in the New Testament to talk about spiritual fatherhood, most notably by St. Paul, "I do not write this to make you ashamed, but to admonish you as my beloved children. For though you have countless guides in Christ, you do not have many fathers. **For I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel.**" (1 Cor. 4:14-15). Is St. Paul ignoring Jesus' command?

Jesus frequently uses images, metaphors, analogies, parables, and even hyperbole (exaggeration)! Remember, "If your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out!" To understand His teaching, we need to think about what He's saying, the context, and we need to read it in the context of the rest of the Scripture as well. In this case, He actually spells it out at the end of the passage: "The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

Last spring, one of the St. Al's students gave me a "Michigan Tech Dad" decal for my car. It was meant in part as a joke, but I put it on my car and have it there proudly. So far, everyone's been able to understand that it isn't literal! :)

This coming weekend we will begin our celebration of our Patronal Feast (St. Albert the Great, Nov. 15th) on Friday, Nov. 10th. After Mass & Dinner, a group will head up to the MTU - NMU Hockey Game, which will also be played on our big screen TV! We'll fry turkeys, and have fireworks, too!

I'm very grateful to Fr. Frank for coming to cover Masses this past week, especially as his family is dealing with the grave illness of his sister, Bernadette, who is in hospice care. Please keep her in your prayers!
